RECYCLING GIFT WRAP

- It is estimated that 2.3 million pounds of wrapping paper ends up in landfills every year.
- Unfortunately, not all wrapping paper can be recycled. Foil or glitter-decorated paper cannot be put in curbside recycling bins. A general rule of thumb is if it scrunches, it **can't** be recycled.
- Before recycling your gift wrap, remove any tape and decorations, such as bows and ribbons. Bows and ribbons can be reused next holiday season to save money and material.
